WHAT IS A THEMATIC PROGRAM?

A thematic program is an interdisciplinary module that aims to create a new generation of professionals capable of responding to major scientific and/or socio-economic challenges of the 21st century.

These modules are related to Master courses and give the students transversal skills thanks to solid training and rich international collaborations.

Students who participate in a thematic program can benefit from :

- A state of the art curricular through and for research in the 1st and 2nd years of Master ;
- A 2-year-scholarship (equivalent to €16,000) for students not holding a french baccalaureate ;
- Mobility grants for an internship abroad ;
- French language courses.

Presentation of **LWAW** thematic program

What is LWAW?

The "*Living well, aging well*" program is aimed at aging as a global phenomenon, from the cell to society. Through research, it aims to build innovative training pathways that will allow us to accompany the demographic changes in our societies.

Interdisciplinary training

The "*Living Well, aging Well*" tackles the societal challenge of individual and collective aging. Because ageing is heterogeneous and multifactorial, it offers original transdisciplinary training at the interface between health, humanities and social sciences. This initiative is conducted to support the emergence of new, global approaches in research and in education.

Built around the faculty of Health, Sport, Humanities, Societies, this program relies on a very rich and large teaching approach and intensive schools promoting creativity. Furthermore, it is backed by cutting-edge research projects from the fields of health, sociology, psychology, history, law, social and solidarity economy, along with the Sciences and Techniques in Physical and Sports Activities (STAPS) department/program.

It must encourage the adaptation and creation of new jobs that will respond to the health, societal, economic, and ethical issues raised by aging as a process that is not limited to the question of old age but concerns life paths in their entirety.

LWAW's detailed program

One Interdisciplinary workshop program, one in M1 and one in M2 (6 ECTS each), for example :

- History of ages and well-being ;
- Health behaviors and aging ;
- Access to Healthcare and aging ;
- Innovation for housing and aging ;
- Aging as a young person: business and self-image ;
- Design and aging well ;
- New healthcare for aging ;
- Job opportunities in an aging society ;
- Vaccine and aging ;
- Gerontechnology ;
- Ethics and law.

How to apply?

Step 1 – Application to a Master's degree or Engineering School that participates in the Graduate School

Apply for the master of your choice among those participating in the LWAU thematic program – See the list on page 3

When : you must check the Master's deadlines

Step 2 – Application to the thematic program

Once admitted to the master's degree, apply for the thematic program by connecting to the GS@UGA website : www.univ-grenoble-alpes.fr/research/graduate-school/
Then, contact the LWAU thematic program coordinator by email (see contact section).

When : as soon as you have received your master's admission letter.
You will receive a notification in case of acceptance or refusal by email.

Scholarships

Graduate School@UGA provides scholarships based on the academic excellence of students (not hold a french baccalaureate) enrolled in one of the 15 thematic programs.

The scholarship amount is 13,000 € (8,000 € for the 1st year of the Master's degree and 5,000 € for the second year), plus an internship grant of up to 3,000 € (depending on the internship period).

Graduate School@UGA scholarships are granted for two years (no scholarship is possible if the student registers only in the second year).

You must show interest in the scholarship through your motivation letter when applying for the thematic program.

Selection is by interview (the motivation of the candidate, the adequacy of his or her profile to the thematic program and his or her linguistic abilities will be evaluated). You will be notified before the start of the academic year (between March and June)
